Logistics

Due to space constraints, all sessions are in rooms set classroom style for maximum occupancy as deemed by the facility and in accordance with local fire safety codes. Presenters should anticipate an audience size of approximately 30 to 100 people per session (more in some cases) and should design their presentation approaches with the facility logistics in mind. Please note we are unable to modify or alter seating arrangements/set-ups for individual sessions. Rooms are equipped with standardized audio-visual: projector, screen, speakers, and a lavalier mic.
